

ARES INCIDENT INFORMATION NET SCRIPT

Approximately 5 minutes prior to net: Is this frequency clear? [*Hearing nothing, continue*]. All stations on this frequency please standby, the West Riverside County Amateur Radio Emergency Services Incident Information Net will begin in approximately 5 minutes. A clear frequency during the drill will be appreciated. This is (your call sign).

QST, QST, QST. This is the West Riverside County Amateur Radio Emergency Services (ARES) Incident Information Net. A clear frequency during the net is requested and appreciated. My name is _____, *callsign*, and I will be serving as net control.

This net is due to _____ (incident) _____ and ARES is activating an Information Net to provide summary information as a public service to amateur radio operators during the incident. Should a full activation be requested to support any of our served agencies, including the Riverside and Moreno Valley RACES, or the Red Cross, our ARES Operators will already be active and informed.
